Successfully overcome/ जीतना

1

## UNPARALLELED

Better or worse than anyone or anything like it / अप्रूव

2. War crimes of this type are **unparalleled** in history.

## ELIMINATE

Completely remove or get rid of/ हटाना

1. We should work on the **elimination** of our competition.
2. Doctors seek to **eliminate** the cause of the pandemic.

## ACCENTUATE

Make more noticeable or prominent/ मुख्य आकर्षण

4

1. The museum has **accentuated** still life art.
2. Color black **accentuates** my features.

## SABOTAGE

The action of damaging something / नाकाम करना

5

1. The plan was to **sabotage** their disagreements.
2. Limit time with people who **sabotage** your efforts.

# WORDS

## FRIVOLOUS

1

**Not serious in content, attitude or behaviour**  
/ तुच्छ

1. I just decided I was a bit too **frivolous** to be a doctor.
2. This is a **frivolous** way of attacking the problem.

## UNDERPIN

2

**Confirm or support with evidence or authority** / पिन से लगाना

1. Certain qualities and values **underpin** good journalism.
2. We very much hope that such reforms will **underpin** the peace process.

## DECORUM

3

**Propriety in manners and conduct** / शिष्टाचार

1. I was treated with **decorums** and respect throughout the investigation.
2. She behaves with **decorum**.

## NULLIFY

4

**Declare invalid** / मंसूख

1. How can we **nullify** the enemy's propaganda?
2. It can **nullify** the evil eye.

## CONSTRUE

5

**Make a sense of, assign a meaning to** / टीका कराना

1. Different lawyers may **construe** the same law differently.
2. We are taught to **construe** these terms in a particular way.



# WORDS

## DISTRUST

1

a feeling of not being able to believe on someone or something/ शक

1. They had been brought up to **distrust** strangers.
2. I had no reason to **distrust** his motives.

## OPTIMISTIC

2

expecting good things to happen or something to be successful/ आशावादी

1. She is **optimistic** about her chances of winning a gold medal.
2. She ended her speech on an **optimistic** note.

## ORTHODOX

3

things people mostly and usually do or accept / रूढ़िवादी

1. Burke's views were **orthodox** in his time.
2. We need to change our **Orthodox** mindsets in order to evolve.

## CREDULOUS

4

showing too much readiness to believe in something/ आसानी से भरोसा करने वाले

1. They were too **credulous** in accepting his version of events.
2. Its claims were so ridiculous even the most **credulous** consumer would not take them seriously"

## CENSURE

5

telling someone, specially in a formal way, that he/she has done something wrong/निंदा

1. Two MPs were singled out for **censure**.
2. Only Beckett seems to have escaped **censure**, because of his elegance and self-restraint.

## SUSTAINABILITY

1

The ability to be maintained at a certain rate or level/  
टिकाऊ

1. Schemes to ensure the long-term **sustainability** of the project.
2. The **sustainability** of economic growth.

## ALIGNMENT

2

The act of aligning, a position of agreement and alliance / सीधा

1. The tiles had slipped out of **alignment**.
2. Her teeth were out of **alignment** with each other.

## INEXPLICABLE

3

Incapable of being explained or accounted for/  
अनसुलझा

1. She had an **inexplicable** change of heart.
2. The book became a hit thanks to Singh's gift for explaining the **inexplicable**.

## CONSUMMATE

4

Perfect and complete in every respect / हर तरह से संपूर्ण

1. They did not **consummate** their marriage until months after it took place.
2. She dressed with **consummate** elegance.

## PERVASIVE

5

Spreading or spread throughout / फैलनेवाला

1. There was a **pervasive** smell of cooking in the entrance hall.
2. But it's the **pervasive** humour that wins through, thanks to a nicely crafted script.



# WORDS

## NAIVE

1

showing lack of experience, wisdom or judgement / भोला-भाला

1. She wasn't always as innocent and **naive** as she seemed.
2. He was **naive** about this due to his inexperience.

## FEASIBLE

2

something that can be done easily or conveniently; able to be made, done, or achieved / संभव

1. We are looking for the most **feasible** scenario. We are still looking for **feasible** solutions in new areas of the design space.

## DISPUTE

3

an argument or disagreement / विवाद

1. There is a labor **dispute** between workers and management.
2. The two farmers are involved in a land **dispute**.

## VEGAN

4

a person who does not eat or use any animal products, such as meat, fish, eggs, cheese, or leather / शाकाहारी

1. **Vegans** get all the protein they need from nuts, seeds, and cereals.
2. She decided to turn **vegan** after watching a documentary about how poultry is raised.

## DISMISSED

5

order to send away or leave / खारिज

1. He **dismissed** the opinion polls as worthless.
2. His supporters **dismissed** the allegations as politically motivated.
