1. Mr Spero was **reluctant** to ask for help.
2. The police are very **reluctant** to get involved in this sort of thing.

## EXTRAORDINARY

3

**very unusual and special /** असाधारण

1. Being chairman gave him an **extraordinary** sense of power.
2. She was an **extraordinary** woman, and no one will ever forget her.

## APPROACH

4

**to come nearer to something or someone/**  
पहुँच

1. We could see the train **approaching** from a distance.
2. If you **approach** someone, you meet or communicate directly with that person.

## AMBIVERT

5

**a person who has features of both an introvert and an extrovert in their personality/** उभयमुखी

1. **Ambiverts** are sometimes also called outgoing or social introverts.
2. An **ambivert** typically enjoys other people, but needs time alone.
